

Impact of Sports Premium 2017 - 2018



What is Sports Premium?

The government is providing additional funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport and will be allocated to primary school Headteachers.

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

This means that you should use the premium to:

- Develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers.
- Make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

Sports Apprentice	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Having a sports apprentice has had positive impact on the school. In addition to working as a TA in the mornings, our sports apprentice completed sporting interventions with children in lessons who are working below or above national average. Additionally, the apprentice introduced lunch time clubs for children in Key Stage 2 as well as supporting the football coach with extra curricular activities. • Mr Hall has contributed to increase the levels of engagement in sport. • Mr Hall contributed to the wider life of the school including the organising of activity days. • Pupil surveys indicated increased participation in a range of activities on the MUGA eg, basketball, hockey. 	£5460
Coaching and Support	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staff surveys indicated that dance and gymnastics was the area in which they had least confidence in teaching. • All staff attended coaching courses in all areas of PE and feedback indicate that there is increased confidence in the delivery of these areas. • Mrs Simpson worked with staff throughout the school to help develop confidence and individual skills, in the delivery of dance and PE sessions. This is ongoing and with continue to develop throughout the next academic year. Resources and planning time provided. 	Included in bespoke SLA – £5110 £120

	In addition, individualised CPD needs were identified through the thorough analysis of the staff surveys. A variety of different CPD events were attended by teachers in the school who then disseminated the good practice within their phase teams. This will continue into the next academic year.	
Specialist Teacher Support	The PE coordinator received over 4 hours of support from PE Specialist Gareth Hamblin. During this time, the new assessment and tracking system was reviewed and an overview of the Core Tasks was provided to enable the PE Co-ordinator to monitor the use of these within PE sessions. School Games Mark	In the 2017 - 2018 school year, Ox Close achieved the School Games Mark Silver Award . It was indicated that Ox Close had an increased number of young leaders and an increased participation in events of those children that are typically less active. Tracking systems indicate that there was an increase of 50%. School Games Mark is a Government led awards scheme to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community.	
Competitions and Events	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 210 children attended events ran by Sedgefield SSP. Children were targeted from different year groups and a variety of sports were chosen. Festivals were also introduced to all Reception children. • A significant increase of children participated in events organised by the SSP • Opportunities were provided for a wide range of events including the participation in our first Swimming Festival. • One pupil successfully qualified for level 3 competition at a county level. <p>Mrs Simpson (Gymnastics specialist) organised an intra school gymnastics festival for children in Key Stage 2, to provide increased opportunities to participate in competition.</p> <p>All children in Key Stage 2 were given the opportunity to compete in termly, intra school events including rounders and cross country.</p> <p>Pupil surveys indicated that children would like a kit for competitions outside of school. They designed their own kit and 60 kits were provided for the children. Additionally, children requested new PE/luchtime equipment eg, new footballs, hoops etc.</p>	<p>Included in basic SLA - £1500</p> <p>£2200</p>
After School Club Provision	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ox Close students had opportunities to participate in a range of after school sporting clubs including a new Hockey Club and Invasion games club. • Other clubs included dance, gymnastics, netball, football, dodgeball, multi-skills, Invasion games. • There was a 22% increase of children attending after school clubs. • Parents and pupils were consulted to identify sporting clubs they would like to be available in 2017 – 2018. 	
External Agencies	In addition to the School Sports Partnership support, Ox Close also employ external agencies. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mr Football taught Basic Moves through the academic year and in holidays. • Transform Fitness worked with all Year 5/6 children. • All KSI classes attended South Durham Gym Club weekly. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 'Sc.Out.Ed' worked with a number of children, staff and parents on OAA. This involved CPD for staff, teachers shadowing professionals with children and extra-curricular activities. A Play Council was established, which organises and facilitates a range of OAA activities each lunchtime. 	
Young Leaders	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A group of ten Y5 children in school completed the Sports Leader Playmaker Award, a national certificate for sports leadership. These children helped organise regular lunch time activities to help engage the least active children in sporting activities. • All children in Y5/6, as part of the disability awareness package, took part in a taster day where they experienced activities including blind football and sitting volleyball. Transport	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The huge increase in participation in competitions and events was due to increased funding enabling expenditure on transport. This allowed participation in events further afield. 	£2500
