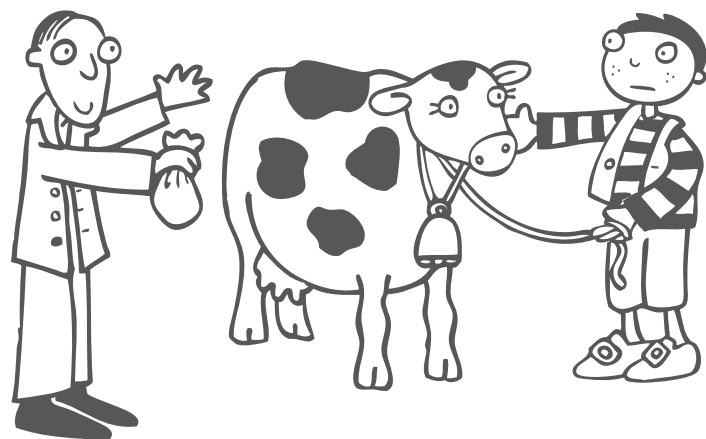


Jack and the Beanstalk
