<b>Activity</b>	<p><b>Starter:</b></p> <p>What do you already know about Henry VIII?</p> <p>-Write ideas in a mind map.</p> <p><b>Main:</b></p> <p>Use the powerpoint to discuss main parts of Henry's life.</p> <p>Key ideas to discuss with children:</p> <p>-Henry VIII six wives. -Henry's break from the Catholic Church.</p>	<p><b>Starter:</b></p> <p>What can you remember about the names of colours in French?</p> <p>-Children to write down as many as they can remember.</p> <p><b>Main:</b></p> <p>Using the wordmat go back over the colours and their English versions.</p> <p><b>Independent:</b></p> <p>Children to colour code a drawing based</p>	<p><b>Starter:</b></p> <p>Recap what we already know about maps.</p> <p>Key discussions to have with the children:</p> <p>-Why do we have and use maps? -What do the different symbols on the map stand for?, (eg. blue bird represents a nature reserve) -What do the numbers on a map mean? <p>(The English Reformation)</p> <p><b>Independent:</b></p> <p>Children to create a timeline use facts from the powerpoint highlighting significant events in Henry VIII life.</p>	<p>on sentences where the English colour has been swapped for the French word for it, eg. ## Henry VIII's Interpretation Today

When most people think of Henry VIII today they think automatically of an obese King who had six wives and who chopped the heads off two of them!

However, there is much more to Henry VIII than just wives and a big waistline!



## What Did Henry VIII Achieve as King?

Henry VIII was King of England from 1509 – 1547, and during that time, he **achieved** a great deal.

- He oversaw the **union** of England and Wales in the Laws in Wales Act of 1535;
- he **joined** England with Ireland in the Crown of Ireland Act of 1542;
- he expanded the **control** of royal power over his subjects;
- he oversaw the **English Reformation**;
- he used **execution** as a punishment for treason and heresy (mainly against people who tried to oppose him);
- he spent so much money on the Royal Courts he was on the verge of **bankruptcy**.

All of the descriptions apply to Henry VIII!

Although we view Henry VIII as the obese womaniser he became in his later years, he was a true Prince Charming in his younger years.



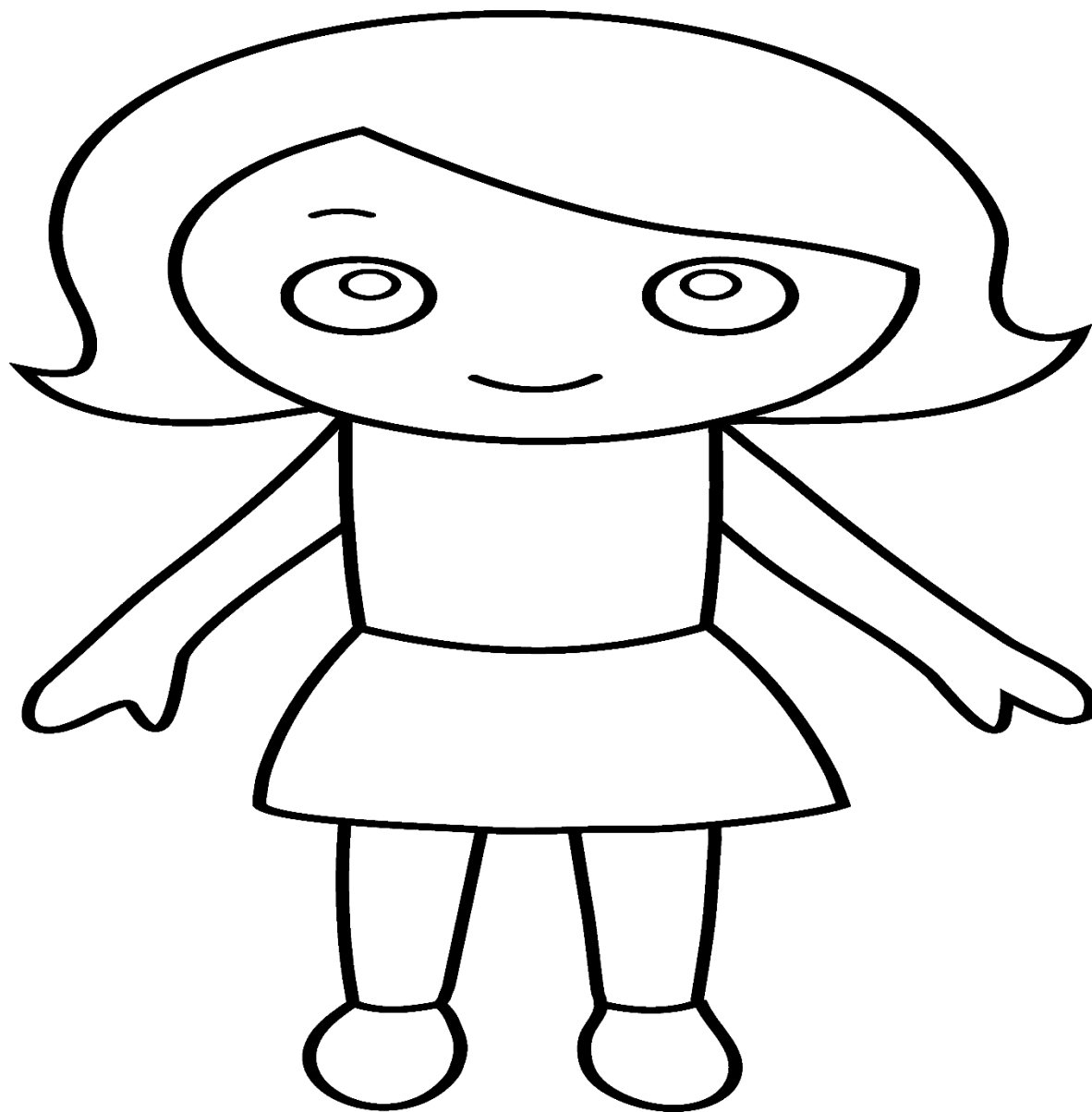

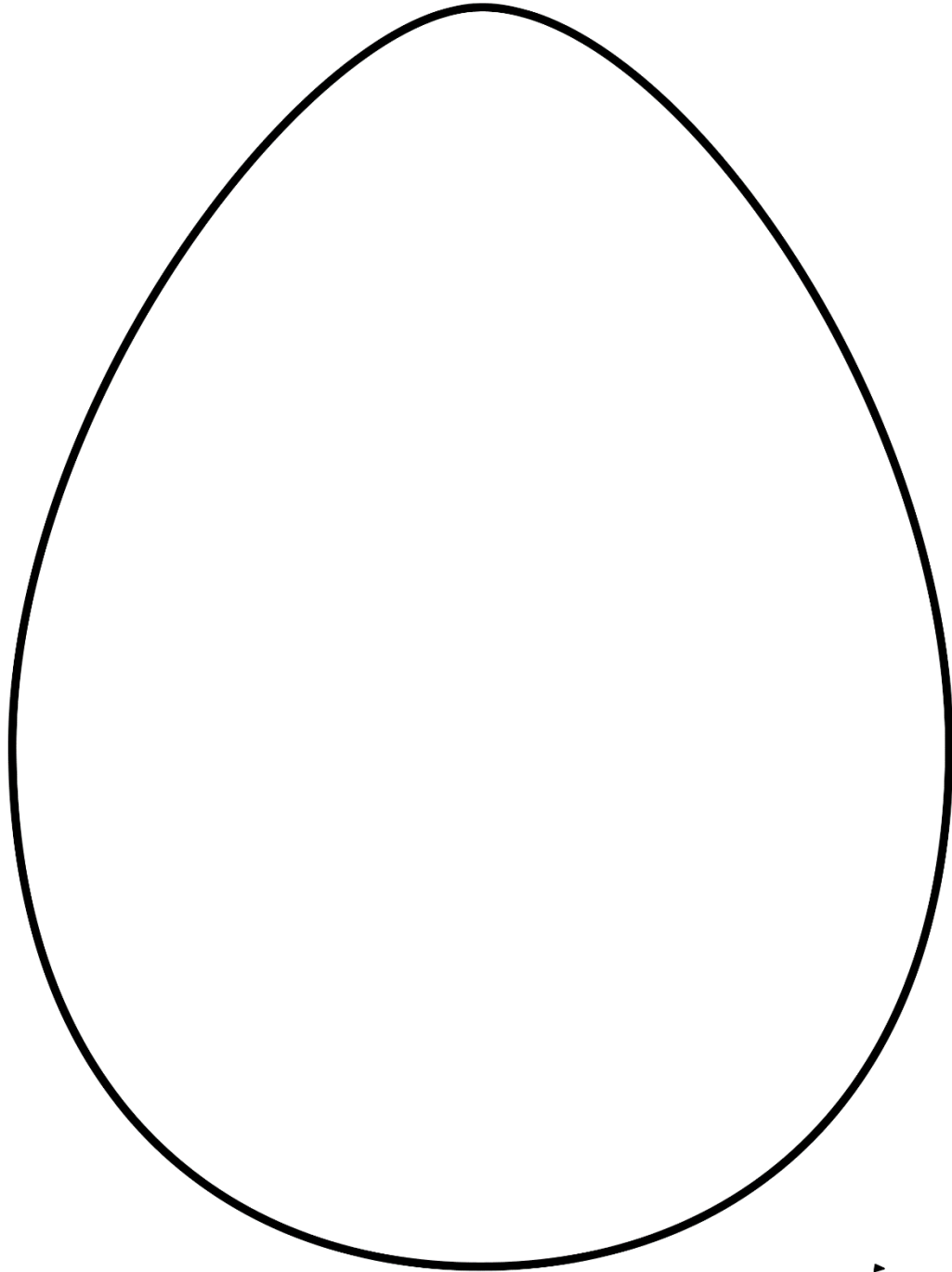
