<b>Read, Write, Inc</b>	<p>Practise all sounds in the booklet your child brought home <b>(you could write each of these sounds onto card and have a pack of speed sounds to flick through)</b></p> <p>Join in with Ruth Miskin for RWI speed sounds 1 or 2 (depending on which booklet your child has)</p> <p><b>Read some green card words: let children say each sound to blend together (if they find it hard get them to do it lots of times, saying the sounds until they are really quick, then they may hear the word.)</b></p>	<p>Join in with Ruth Miskin for RWI speed sounds 1 or 2 (depending on which booklet your child has)</p> <p>Practise forming the first sound in their booklet.</p> <p>Discuss words that begin with that sound.</p>	<p>Join in with Ruth Miskin for RWI speed sounds 1 or 2 (depending on which <u>booklet</u> your child has)</p> <p>Read some green card words.</p>	<p>Join in with Ruth Miskin for RWI speed sounds 1 or 2 (depending on which booklet your child has)</p> <p>Practise forming the first sound in their booklet.</p> <p>Discuss words that begin with that sound.</p> <p><b>Read their reading book.</b></p>	<p>Join in with Ruth Miskin for RWI speed sounds 1 or 2 (depending on which booklet your child has)</p> <p>Read some green card words</p>

Which was your favourite part? Why? What might happen next?</p>	<p>Read/watch the story again. Talk about the story. Can they think what might happen to Jack next?</p>	<p>Talk about the story Jack and the Beanstalk. Can your child retell the story in their own words?</p> <p><b>Activity:</b> ask your child to draw a picture from the story: can they write labels for their picture?</p> <p>some children will be able to:</p> <p>a. hear initial sounds only e.g e for egg, j for jack</p> <p>b. be able to hear more sounds in the words e.g egg for egg, beenstork for beanstalk (please encourage your child to sound out the words and find them on their speed sounds chart that we gave all of them)</p> <p>c. be able to write simple sentences about the story e.g Jack went up the beanstalk. He stole the egg.</p> <p><b>Important: support your child be using your fingers to sound each word out and for children to write the sounds they hear/know (you can point them out on the speed sounds chart).</b></p>	<p>Talk about the story and how there are different versions of the same story. Can they change a character in the story and tell it again eg. Maybe a there wasn't a giant but a talking horse. Maybe Jack was a girl, maybe there weren't magic beans but a magic animal etc.</p> <p>It is good for children's imagination and there are no right or wrong answers.</p> <p>You could come up with lots of funny and imaginative stories by just changing one thing from the original.</p>	<p>End the week with a sequencing activity: (sources on Twinkl) children could use picture and put them in order. Talk about how they know which picture comes at the beginning/middle and end of the story.</p> <p>If you can't get pictures ask your child to draw a picture from the beginning/middle and end of the story and put them in order. Talk about them and use them to retell the story.</p>
