<b>Activity</b>	<p>LC: Can you draw and label your favourite animal?</p> <p>Think about your favourite animal. Why is it your favourite animal? What does it look like? How could you describe it to someone else?</p> <p>Draw a picture of your favourite animal. You can colour it in if you like. Now can you add some labels to describe it? You could use some nouns and adjectives eg brown fur, long legs etc.</p>	<p>LC: Can you research your favourite animal?</p> <p>Look at the picture of your favourite animal that you drew and labelled yesterday. What do you know about the animal?</p> <p>Use books, internet or talk to an adult about the animal and find out as many facts as you can. You could highlight the facts or make some notes on paper.</p>	<p>LC: Can you create an animal fact file?</p> <p>Using the facts you found out yesterday, can you use the template on the next page to create your own animal fact file about your favourite animal?</p> <p>What is the most interesting fact you've found out? Can you tell an adult about your animal using the fact file?</p>	<p>LC: Can you create an animal quiz?</p> <p>Using your fact file, have some fun with your family by giving them a quiz. Ask them some questions about your favourite animal and see if they can answer them.</p> <p>Who scored the most?</p>	<p>LC: Can you answer questions about a text?</p> <p>Look at the reading comprehension paper attached and read it with an adult or on your own. Can you answer the questions about it?</p>
