Who were the characters? Who do you think was the cleverest Billy Goat? Why? Can you describe the troll?</p>	<p>Read or watch the story again.</p> <p>Can they join in with “who’s that trip trapping over my bridge?”</p> <p>Activity: Which other words could be used to describe how the goats go over the bridge? Stamp, tramp, jump, run etc</p> <p>Can you change the phrase? e.g. who’s that jumping over my bridge? Who’s that stamping over my bridge?</p> <p>(You could take turns being the troll and the goats and say the new phrases)</p>	<p>Ask your child to tell you the story in their own words.</p> <p>Activity: Make some hand puppets (with sticks and paper)</p> <p>Use the puppets to retell the story.</p>	<p>Who is your favourite character in the story?</p> <p>Activity: Children to draw their favourite character: Can they write labels? some children will be able to: a) Hear initial sounds only e.g. g for goat, t for tail b) Be able to hear more sounds in the words e.g. for goat (please encourage your child to sound out the words and find them on their speed sounds chart that we gave all of them) c) Be able to write simple sentences about the story e.g. the gowt (goat) went ovir (over) the bridj (let them spell it the way they know!)</p> <p><i>Important: support your child be using your fingers to sound each word out and for children to write the sounds they hear/know (you can point them out on the speed sounds chart).</i></p>	<p>Do you know any other stories where there are 3 characters? (3 little pigs, 3 bears) Which one is your favourite?</p> <p>Activity: Can you retell your favourite story?</p> <p>You could draw pictures of your favourite character(s).</p>
