If you do not have a printer please just write your answers on paper.</p>	<p>Main</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Today we are going to practise using a verb in a sentence. • I would like you to think of transport and animals. <p>Independent Draw a picture of 2 -3 types of transport and 2 -3 different animals Write a verb under each picture to describe how it moves eg: bunny = hops, boat = sails. Now write a sentence to describe each picture. You could challenge yourself to also include some adjectives in your sentence – we practised these before Easter. Eg: The enormous, white boat sailed out into the deep, blue ocean.</p>	<p>Main</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Today I would like you to plan a silly story about a school trip. • This is something we were going to do in class to enter a competition. • You would still be able to enter the competition yourself if you wish to. • Please look at Thursday's resource sheet for more information. • Have a look at the examples below for some ideas about where you might want to go. <p>Independent Plan your Silly School Trip. I have attached an example of how you might want to set it out.</p>	<p>Main</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Today I would like you to write a Silly Story about a school trip. • Remember, you will need a beginning, middle and ending. • For example: • Get transport to the destination (beginning) • Go on the trip – what happens? Why? How? (middle) • Get back to school with news of what happened, a souvenir or even be delayed due to traffic! (end) <p>Some examples of other children's stories are below. Independent Start writing your story – I know it will be amazing! Don't forget your capital letters and full stops, and that neat handwriting we have been working on! Form your letters correctly and sit them on the line.</p>

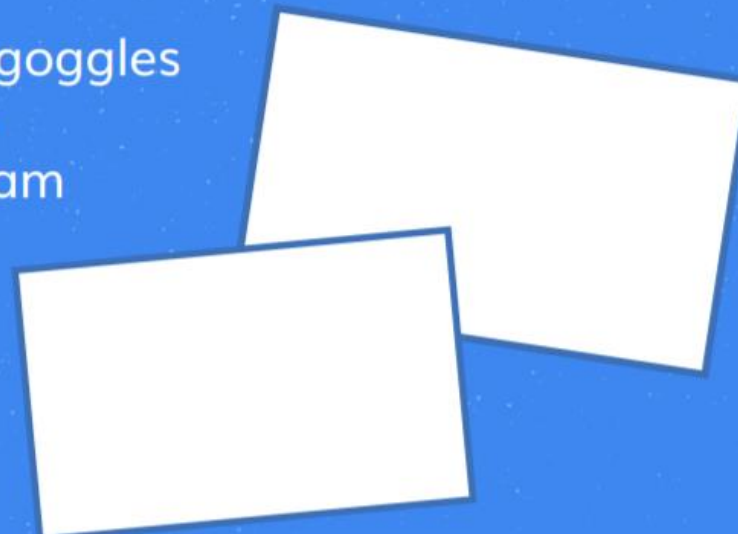
