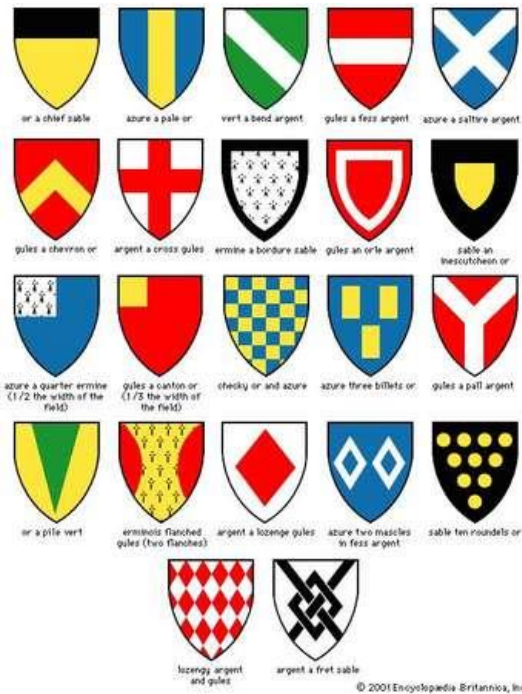

Activity	<p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/zqr4d2p</p> <p>Watch Barnaby Bear and Becky go back in time and pretend to be a King and Queen.</p> <p>Who else might have lived in a castle?</p> <p>Activity: Show children a picture of a medieval court jester and discuss their role.</p> <p>Challenge: Can children come up with a trick, joke, dance or song they would entertain the court?</p> <p>Take a video.</p>	<p>Discuss the life cycle of a frog. What does it start as? Talk through the different stages.</p> <p>Activity: Drag and drop life cycle activity: https://www.topmarks.co.uk/Search.aspx?q=frog%20game</p> <p>Choose: Life Cycle of a Frog</p> <p>A drag and drop activity to see if you can complete the diagram of the life cycle of a frog.</p> <p>Challenge: Draw the life cycle of a frog and label them.</p>	<p>Warm ups: move around the area in different ways: jumping, skipping, hopping, galloping etc.</p> <p>Activity: Kick a ball to your child and ask them to stop it with their foot. Can they kick it back to you? Talk about the coat of arms knights had on their shields.</p> <p>Ask your child: What colours/shapes/patterns do you like?</p> <p>Activity: Design a coat of arms that you can make into a shield if you want to.
