Who were the characters? Why was the duck tired? What should the farmer have done? What was the animals plan?</p>	<p>Read or watch the story again. (if reading: can the children spot any action words in the book? Can they sound out simple words?)</p> <p>Can they join in with “how goes the work” “Quack” said the duck.</p> <p>Activity: Find out about jobs that can be done on a farm . Watch Barnaby Bear on the farm to find out about different jobs on a farm.</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=9y4qUfjp5q4</p> <p>Talk about the jobs they found out about.</p> <p>Challenge: can your child act out some of the jobs for you to guess what it is? (pick 4) . Can you make your own song using your animals? You could draw them in the order you sing them.</p> <p>Send your work to the email address you have been given so that we can see them.</p>	<p>Have you ever been to a farm? Look at any photos of that visit. What did you do/see?</p> <p>Activity: Draw your favourite animal and label it. Write sentences if you are able.</p> <p>some children will be able to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> hear initial sounds only e.g d for duck, f for farmer be able to hear more sounds in the words e.g duc or duk for duck, famr for farmer (please encourage your child to sound out the words and find them on their speed sounds chart that we gave all of them) be able to write simple sentences about the story e.g the duc (duck) wirkt (worked) hard. (let them spell it the way they know!) <p>Important: support your child be using your fingers to sound each word out and for children to write the sounds they hear/know (you can point them out on the speed sounds chart).</p>
