Activity	<p>If you have a bat and ball practise hitting the ball. An adult could throw a soft ball for the child to hit back to them.</p> <p>If you do not have a bat and ball, you can use your hand (with a bean bag, shuttlecock or sponge ball.)</p> <p>Challenge:</p> <p>How many times can you hit the ball with the bat?</p>	<p>Discuss what Rainbow fish looks like? You could make other characters from the story and make your own underwater scene!</p>	<p>What does the word kind mean?</p> <p>How can you be kind?</p> <p>What could you do at home to be a kind friend/brother or sister?</p> <p>How could you be kind to your family?</p> <p>Challenge:</p> <p>Draw a picture of you being kind and write what you did.</p>	<p>Discuss being kind and how you have seen them being kind over the week.</p> <p>Ask them to think of anytime they have seen someone else being kind.</p> <p>Challenge: Make 'scales' out of shiny card and use them to write down some kind things anyone has done.</p> <p>You could put them on the window.</p>
