You will then write a paragraph describing that memory and what you enjoyed about it. If you like, you can draw a picture to go with the memory. Here are some examples: • Starting Year 6 (entering the new classroom etc) • Practising for your class assembly or completing your class assembly • The Christmas Performances • Competing for the school in a basketball, football, dance or gymnastics competition • Singing in the care homes •</p>	<p>Task</p> <p>For your task today, we would like you to reflect on your time at Ox Close Primary School. Unfortunately, we are unable to have our usual leavers assembly where we would listen to messages from staff and pupils. However, we would still like you to write a graduation speech.</p> <p>What would you say? What will Ox Close Primary School be most remembered for? What will you remember the most? (eg, when you are 20, what do you think you will remember about ox close)</p> <p>Would you like to say anything to your friends? Would you like to thank anyone? What advice would you give to children still at Ox Close?</p> <p>The ideas are endless and I am sure that you have so much that you are able to write.</p> <p>When you have completed your speeches, please email them to your year 6 email account.</p>	<p>Main Task</p> <p>Your task today is a nice little task for you to think about.</p> <p>I would like you to think back to when you were in Reception, or even in nursery. When you were younger, it is likely that you didn't think about the years ahead and I imagine that you were busy having lots of fun with your friends. If you looked to the future when you were in Reception, you would probably think about what was happening the next day or the next week.</p> <p>We would like you to think about where you are now and how you got to where you are. What has happened on the way? Celebrations (birthdays etc) parties, school trips etc</p> <p>What would you think if we asked you to think about where you think you will be/what you will be doing in 5 Years time (16 years old)?</p> <p>What do you think you will be doing in 10 Years?</p>	<p>Main Task</p> <p>You task today is another task which requires you to look back on your time at Ox Close and if you would like, right back to when you were born (of course you will need an adult to help you with this part)</p> <p>I would like you to think about the events along your way and place them into chronological order.</p> <p>Eg, Birth started to walk First Birthday Christening Started nursery Baby brother/sister born</p> <p>Etc. Everyone will have a different story to tell and they will have followed a different path to get to where we are now.</p> <p>Once you have made your list of events, you might like to record your journey on a winding road which is split into small sections. You could write each of your events/milestones in each section.</p>

	<p>Making/drawing something in Art or DT • Anything else! It could be a memory you have of a fun lesson, a good playtime or a game on the yard or field.</p>		<p>What about 20 years?</p> <p>You might even think about 30 Years time.</p> <p>I would like you to record your thoughts on the attached sheet and it would be lovely to see where you see yourself in the future.</p> <p>Perhaps you will go to college. You might even go to university to follow your dreams of becoming a nurse, teacher, actor – the list is endless.</p> <p>You might even go to college and then you might like to gain an apprenticeship.</p> <p>Enjoy this task. There is no right or wrong answer but it will be lovely to look back in years to come to see where you saw yourself.</p>	<p>Think about how you will place these into chronological order and also ways in which you could illustrate your work.</p> <p>I have attached some ideas for you.</p> <p>Remember, you don't need to begin from birth, you could begin from the time you started nursery/school.</p>
